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THE GREAT MERITS **OF SPENDING FOR ALLAH**

Sadagah (charity) is an Arabic term that refers to voluntary charity or giving in the way of Allah. There are many benefits associated with giving sadagah.

One of the main virtues of sadagah is that it is a means of purifying one's wealth and earning the pleasure of Allah. By giving in charity, a person demonstrates their willingness to part with their wealth for the sake of Allah, and in doing so, they purify their wealth from any negative or harmful elements. This act of purification is considered a means of attaining spiritual purity and closeness to Allah. Sadagah is also believed to be a means of seeking forgiveness and expiation of sins. It is said that sadagah extinguishes the wrath of Allah and brings about His forgiveness.

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In addition, sadagah is believed to have numerous worldly benefits, such as increasing one's wealth, protecting one from calamities and disasters. and bringing about blessings and prosperity in one's life.

Some of the great virtues of charity can be understood from the Quran and Hadith.

"The example of those who spend their wealth in the way of Allah is like a seed (of grain) which grows seven spikes: in each spike is a hundred grains. And Allah multiplies (His reward) for whom He wills. And Allah is all-Encompassing and Knowing." (2:261)

"Those who spend their wealth (in the path of Allah) by night and by day, secretly and publicly - shall have their reward with their Lord. And no fear will affect them, nor will they grieve." (2:274)

"Spend (in charity) out of the sustenance that We have bestowed on vou before that time when death will come to someone, and he shall say: "O my Lord! If only you would grant me



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reprieve for a little while, then I would spend in charity, and be among the righteous." (63:10)

"They ask you what they should spend in charity. Say: 'Whatever you spend with a good heart, give it to parents, relatives, orphans, the helpless, and travellers in need. Whatever good you do, Allah is aware of it." (2:215)

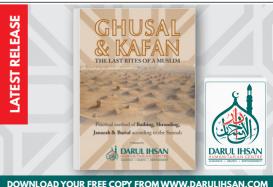
Nabi & said: "The believer's shade on the Day of Resurrection will be his charity." (Tirmizi)

Nabi said: "Save yourself from hellfire by giving even half a datefruit in charity." (Bukhari)

Nabi **said**, "The one who looks after a widow or a poor person is like a Mujahid (warrior) who fights for Allah's Cause, or like him who performs prayers all the night and fasts all day." (Bukhari)

In a Hadith Qudsi: Almighty Allah says: "O people, spend and I will spend upon you." (Bukhari)

From another Hadith we learn, "Wealth is not decreased by Sadagah." (Muslim)



DANGERS OF TAKFEER

DECLARING MUSLIMS TO BE DISBELIEVERS

Faith and Iman is a matter of the heart. No human being has knowledge of what is concealed within the chest of a person, unless the person openly declares his disbelief. Therefore, extreme caution must be exercised regarding any pronouncement of kufr (disbelief).

The popular position of Imam A'zam, Abu Hanifah (R) regarding Takfeer is well known. He stated that if there are ninety nine reasons or proofs to consider a Muslim a kafir (non-believer) and there is just one reason or avenue to protect and retain a Muslim's faith, then recognise that one aspect and consider the person to be Muslim. This opinion of Imam Abu Hanifah (R) is supported by the Ahadith of Nabi \$\mathbb{K}\$.

Nabi & said, "He who says to his brother

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'O disbeliever', then it returns upon one of them." (Bukhari, Muslim, Tirmizi and Abu Dawud)

In another narration it is mentioned "...And he who accuses a believer of Kufr (disbelief) then it is like killing him..." (Bukhari)

Once a group of Sahabah were on an expedition. A Sahabi, Hazrat Usamah was about to slay a man when the person declared the Shahadah and accepted Islam. Hazrat Usamah presumed that he was only saying the Kalimah to save his life and therefore killed him. When this was brought to the attention of Nabi, he became perturbed and reprimanded this Sahabi by exclaiming; Did you open his chest and look in his heart (to determine whether he is a kafir or not?). What answer are you going to give on the day of Qiyamah about this person saying La Ilaha Illallah?! (Tafsir ibn Kathir)

Today, it is regrettable that labeling Ulama and righteous people as kafir and murtad (apostate), has been trivialised and almost normalised. No contempt or concern is shown when it happens, as though people have been desensitised of its seriousness. This has created an extremist and radical mindset in some ordinary and ignorant Muslims who have also adopted this practice. A true Muslim is cautious and concerns himself with his own actions and accountability.

Islam Means To 'WISH WELL'

Among the beautiful lessons and teachings of Islam is to wish well for others. A Muslim is not miserly, selfish or self-centered. A believer truly wishes success and prosperity for others, just as he wishes for himself.

Hazrat Tamim Dari an arrates that Nabi said, "Deen is wishing well." (Sahih Muslim)

Hazrat Jareer bin Abdillah anarrates, "I took Bay'ah (pledge of allegiance) at the hands of Rasulullah upon establishing Salah, discharging Zakah and intending good for every Muslim."

Hazrat Abu Hurairah s narrates that Nabi said, "Do not hate one another,

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do not be jealous of one another, do not cut off from one another and be brothers as the servants of Allah."

Generally, emphasis is placed on Ibadah, Salah, Dua, Zikr, Da'wah and other acts of optional worship. Whilst these acts are important and compliment the spiritual upliftment of a Believer, they do not represent the entire Deen of Islam. Just as we should be particular about acts of worship, we should be equally considerate of the rights of fellow Muslims and humans.

Muslims today lack general etiquette in conduct especially in aspects of gentleness, politeness, courtesy, wishing well and doing good to others. The Quranic injunction is, "O Believers, enter into Islam completely, and do not follow the footsteps of shaytan." (Surah Baqarah - Verse 209)

A Muslim should be concerned about the welfare of the next person and try to benefit people in whichever way possible. If one cannot do good for others, then at least desire good for people and do not harm them.

Islamic Arts Biennale unveils never before seen Quran pages from Uzbekistan

For the first ever Islamic Arts Biennale in Jeddah, a treasure trove of Uzbekistan artifacts have been brought in, giving visitors a chance to marvel mysterious historic valuables.

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Discharge your Fitrah early

As Ramadan draws to a close and we prepare to say our farewell, we feel both sad at the separation from our guest as well as the excitement for Eid. However there are many of our fellow brothers. sisters and children for whom the day of Eid is just another day of toil and strife. The Shariah has made provision to mend the broken hearts of the less fortunate on this day and it comes in the form of Sadagatul Fitr.

Sadagatul Fitr (also known as Fitrah) is compulsory on every Muslim who on the day of Eid has the value of Nisab in access of necessities after subtracting debts. A father will discharge the Sadagatul Fitr on behalf of his minor children.

The significance of Sadagatul Fitr can be understood from the following Hadith:

"The fast remains suspended between the heavens and the earth until fitrah is discharged." (Targhib)

Whilst Muslims do discharge their Fitrah. many do so at the last hour. By discharging Fitrah late, it does not fulfil the purpose of benefitting those in need.

Early payment of Fitrah will allow the recipients to prepare adequately so that they too can enjoy a happy Eid. In keeping with this spirit, we encourage Muslims to discharge their Fitrah a few days before Eid.

Imam Malik (RA) has recorded in Muwatta, that Sayyiduna Abdullah Ibn Umar & would send his Fitrah to the one who was in charge of collection two or three days before Eid. (Fathul Bari)

It is established that Nabi & gave him the glad tidings of being a Shaheed (martyr) and Jannah. He had the honour of participating in the Battle of Uhud and all the subsequent battles with Nabi &. He was martyred in the Battle of Yamamah in 12 A.H. in the era of Hazrat Abu Bakr 🚕. The flag of the Ansaar was in his hand on that occasion. After he was martyred, he appeared in a dream and made a few beguests. These were carried out. He is the only Sahabi who made a beguest after death and they were fulfilled. His children - Ismail, Qays and Muhammad, and Hazrat Anas bin Malik &, narrate Hadith from him

Virtues

Hazrat Abu Hurairah & narrates that Nabi said, "... What an excellent man is Thabit bin Oavs bin Shammas ..." (Tirmizi, Musnad Ahmad)

Once Nabi & said to him, "You will live with goodness, you will die with goodness and Allah will enter you into **Jannah.**" (Al Mu'iamul Kabir lit Tabrani)

On another occasion Nabi & said to him, "You will a praiseworthy life. You will die as a Shaheed and Allah will enter you into Jannah." (Al Mu'jamul Kabir lit Tabrani)

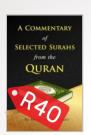
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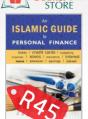
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Seeking the GREAT NIGHT

When is Laylatul Qadr?

Rasulullah # said: "Seek Laylatul Qadr in Ramadan in the last ten nights. Verily, it is during the odd nights, 21st, 23rd, 25th, 27th, 29th or the last night of Ramadan." (Ahmad)

The night commences at Maghrib and last until the break of the dawn.

What is Laylatul Qadr?

Amongst the many blessings of Ramadan is a precious and special night known as Laylatul Qadr - The Night of Power. This great and powerful night is better than a 1000 months (83 years and 4 months).

This night brings an abundance of mercies, forgiveness, spiritual progress and elevation for a Muslim. It is a night to earn Allah Ta'ala's pleasure and the ultimate prize of Jannah.

Allah Ta'ala says: "The Night of Power is better than a thousand months." (Ouran 97:3)

Rasulullah * said: "Whosoever stands in ibadah - worship on this night, with sincere faith and with genuine hope of gaining reward, his previous sins will be forgiven." (Bukhari and Muslim)

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Q&A

Do you have to keep your Qaza fasts before Ramadan comes. Will the Ramadan fasts be invalid if you had not made up the Qaza fasts from the previous Ramadan?

I have many Qaza fasts to keep and worry I will not be able to keep them all before Ramadan.

It is not necessary to keep all one's Qaza fasts before the next Ramadan. It will not affect the validity of the fasts of the current Ramadan. However, Qaza fasts should not be unnecessarily delayed and should keep them as soon as possible after Ramadan.

One may make keep the Qaza however it is easy for one to do so. If one is able to keep them consecutively one may do so. If one

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cannot manage to keep them consecutively then one may keep them on alternate days or however it is easy.

Does sniffing something break the fast? If it does is there any Qaza? What about smelling food, attar or spray or soap or shampoo?

If a physical substance of vapour or similar is inhaled it will break the fast. Merely the smelling the aroma of food or fragrance, etc. does not break the fast.

What is the ruling of sleeping in Ramadan fasting time? Is it true that the sleep of a fasting person is also ibadah?

Fasting is an Ibadah. Therefore, one will be rewarded throughout this time, on condition one is not engaged in sin. Thus if one is sleeping whilst fasting he will also be rewarded. However, one should not spend excessive time sleeping whilst fasting especially during the month of Ramadan. Sleep moderately and spend other free time reciting Quran and doing other forms of Ibadah that are recommended in Ramadan.

Can one use flavoured lip ice whilst fasting?

It is permissible. However, if there is a possibility of it entering the mouth and going down the throat then it will

Does having an internal examination invalidate the fast, and is ghusal necessary?

The fast would be nullified if medication (dry or wet) or anything wet/moist is inserted into the female private part. Qaza will be necessary but not Kaffarah.

Similarly, the fast will break if something dry was inserted, then removed and (the same thing) then reinserted (without being thoroughly dried).

Generally, the ghusal does not break with the above.

can you please explain what is fidyah?

Fidyah is the compensation paid for each missed fast by a very old person who does not have the physical strength to fast or a person who suffers from a debilitating illness with no apparent hope of recovering from the illness. The amount per missed fast is the same as Sadaqtul Fitr.

Those who have hope of recovery and are able to fast in future must keep the missed fasts (make Qadha) as they are able to do so after Ramadan. Fidya will not be valid in this case

Can the six fast of Shawal be kept intermittently during the month or must they be kept consecutively?

The fast may be kept consecutively or intermittently.

Can multiple fast intentions be joined with the fast of Shawal e.g. the fasting on Mondays and Thursdays joined with the intention of Shawal fast?

Yes, multiple intentions can be made in non-compulsory fasts.

Must the Qaza for the missed fast of Ramadan be kept first, before keeping the Shawal fasts?

It is preferred and more cautious that the Qaza be kept first. However, if the Shawal or other Nafl fasts are kept before the Qaza fasts then this will be valid.

"Academia is our main focus, but in terms of holistic development, we have to look into up-skilling children in other ways to provide them with options."...READ MORE

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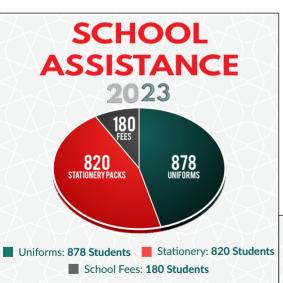

METHOD

Recite the Tasbeeh	
Before Surah Fatiha	15 Times
After the Surah & before Ruku	10 Times
In Ruku after the Tasbeeh	10 Times
In Qowmah (standing position after Ruku)	10 Times
In (first) Sajda after the Tasbeeh	10 Times
In Jalsa (sitting position between the two Sajdas)	10 Times
In (second) Sajda after the Tasbeeh	10 Times

The above method must be applied to every Rakah.

Note:

1. In every Rakat, the Tasbeeh will be recited 75 times totaling 300 times in

Tasbeeh to be recited in Salatut Tasbeeh:

سُبْحَانَ الله وَ الْحَمْدُ للله وَ لَا إِلَهَ إِلَّا اللَّهُ وَ اللَّهُ آكْبَرُ

"Subhan allahi wal hamdulillahi wa la ilaha illal laahu wallahu akbar"

The words

وَلاَ حَوْلَ وَلاَ قُوَّةَ الاَّ بِاللهِ الْعَلِيِّ الْعَظِيْمِ

"La Hawla wala Quwwata Illa billah Alivvil Azeem"
